Here's the scoop...

Worm Works is a micro enterprise owned and operated by Franke Wallitsch, an individual working with MARC Mt Horeb. Worm Works focuses on keeping food waste out of landfills through vermi-culture, which uses red wiggler worms to decompose food waste, turning it into nutrient rich material for plants.

How to make a worm bin: Franke's bins are totes with holes for air flow. Weed block in the bottom is topped Franke screening the with shredded cardboard and red wigglers. The worms Worm Works product are fed two cups of veggies which Franke makes from old produce he collects from Millers Grocery Store. Franke chops and grinds the veggies, adding two cups to each bin weekly. The final ingredient is shredded newspaper, then a lid, and color coded by start date. Franke is working on adding more bins to his business, he has 26

active bins and would like to have 40 very soon. It takes 3 months before

a bin is ready for processing.

Processing Bins: After three months, there is beautiful rich vermi-culture inside the bins. Franke takes this product through 3 different screenings, 1st a large screen, 2nd a little smaller and the 3rd screen is the size of a window screen. The result is a very fine product,

like coffee grounds, and it is ready to be packaged. Franke's favorite task is packaging the finished product! He enjoys the feel of it on his hands. Franke sells Worm Works in 1, 3 and 15 lbs. bags. This year Franke sold almost 400 pounds! Be sure to stop by MARC Mt Horeb to buy Worm Works to feed your garden and plants year round.


